Special Visit, Special Memories

I was recently granted a rare privilege to visit a family who moved to Missouri after adopting two "daughters" through ECFA in 2008 and 2019. Having completed both home studies and all the post-adoption visits required by the country, I got to know the family well, and we have kept in contact over the years.

Loren and Linda Sanders initially heard about ECFA through Linda's mother who was a donor of the agency. They had discussed adoption early in their marriage and always had a deep desire to help orphans and provide a child with an opportunity in life that he/she may not have had otherwise. When Loren and Linda faced many medical challenges in having their own biological children, they believed God was leading them to build their family through adoption. The Sanders were drawn to the country of China because of their love for the culture, people, and Chinese food. They also had friends who had adopted from China.

I completed the initial home studies for the family, and they also worked with one of our partner agencies for international adoptions – America World. Eventually, they were matched with Lucy, a five-month-old who was found on the steps of an orphanage at two days old. The couple traveled to China in May 2008 and returned home with Lucy two weeks later.

A few years later, as Lucy was praying for a "sister," and the Lord had been nudging their hearts, the Sanders felt called again to adopt another child from China. They returned to ECFA for a second home study which was completed in 2017. Within the year, they received a referral for Leah, a fiveyear-old who had been abandoned at three weeks old with pneumonia, behind a boat by a pond. Her eyes, at that time, were tiny slits. After her "rescue," Leah was in the ICU for three weeks. One of the orphanage workers took her home as a foster child until she was adopted by the Sanders. Leah had a diagnosis of Blepharophimosis Syndrome, a condition that mainly affects the development of the eyelids. She had her first eye surgery in 2019 which was successful in extending her eye openings. She had a second surgery later that year to attach slings to the muscles of her forehead and eyelids to open her eyes wider. This surgery was successful as well.

The two girls have been blessed to have parents who dearly love them and have provided them with a wonderful Christian home where they have flourished. Today, these girls have grown to be beautiful young ladies who love the Lord and their family. Lucy is a junior in high school and hopes to be an echocardiogram tech once she graduates, while Leah is in 6th grade and aspires to be a pediatrician.

Meeting this family and coming alongside them in their adoption journeys as part of God's redemptive plan for Lucy and Leah's life has been a true privilege

and blessing. I am excited to watch God's plan unfold in their lives.
